In its present form, the document may be all that a small to medium size venue need develop to strengthen or formalise their compliance program. If this is the case, simply fill in the blank spaces to make some person in your venue responsible for the Controls.

The document is not intended as a one size fits all, but rather as a start-point, to consider what the risks are in your venue and how you might best resolve or minimise those risks.
