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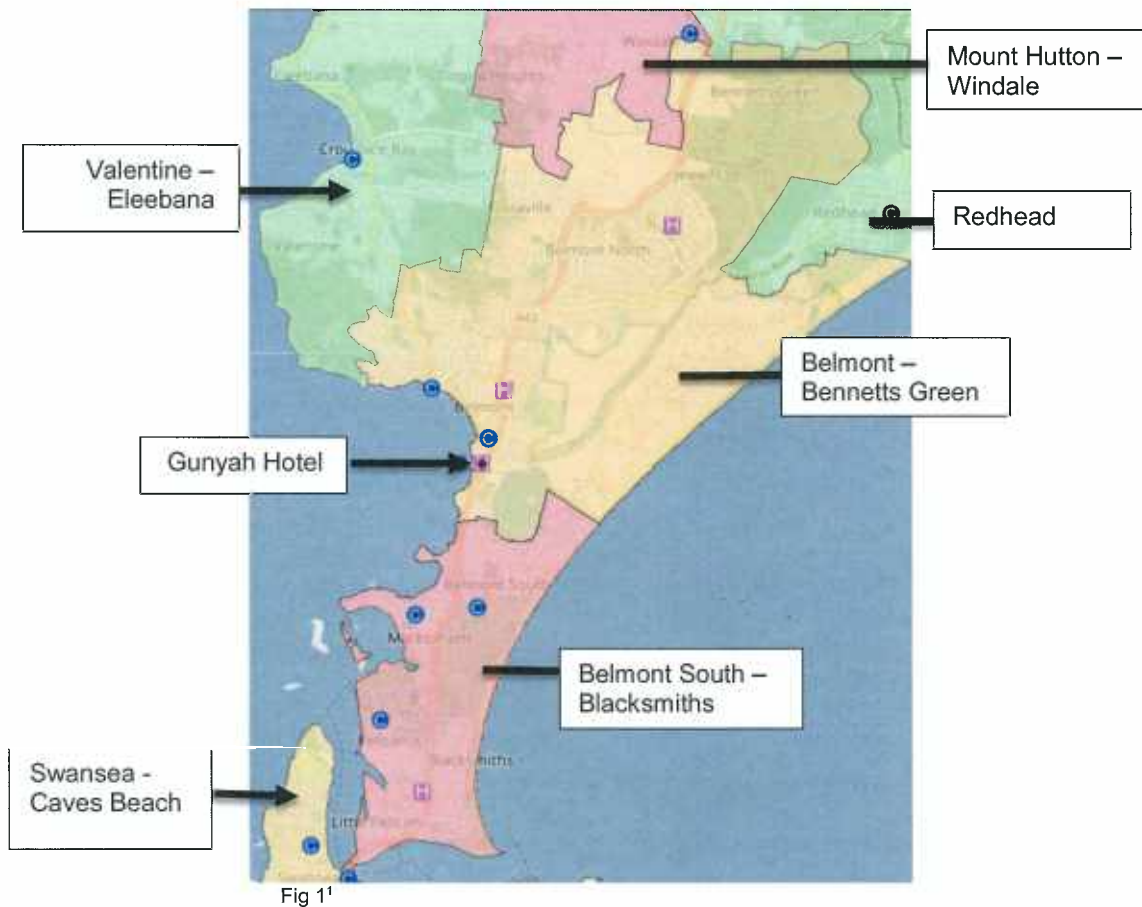
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### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- Venue name: Gunyah Hotel
- Venue address: 644 Pacific Highway and Walter Street, Belmont NSW 2280
- Local Government Area ("LGA"): Lake Macquarie City Council
- ABS Statistical Area Level 2 ("SA2"): Belmont – Bennetts Green
- Current Gaming Machine Threshold (GMT): 17
- Number of gaming machine entitlements ("GME's") held: 17
- Proposed GMT: 30
- The harm minimisation measures and responsible gambling practices and services offered at the Venue are elaborated on below but a summary of the measures and practices and services at the Venue is as follows:
  - a) Separating the gaming room from the remainder of the Venue;
  - b) Free entry;
  - c) The gaming room is not viewable from a public street;
  - d) CCTV monitoring;
  - e) Monitoring by gaming attendant employees;
  - f) A clock is in the room and is set to the correct time;
  - g) The staff involved in monitoring the gaming room and the licensee all hold a Responsible Conduct of Gaming qualification;
  - h) The premises has a self-exclusion scheme that has been effective;
  - i) Brochures and other promotional material is on display warning about the risks of problem gambling and promoting problem gambling counselling services, such as, GameCare (AHA);
  - j) No gaming promotions in the form of gaming inducements are provided.
- Proposed positive contribution:
  - (a) \$645,505.05 to be paid in annual instalments over 5 years into the Responsible Gambling Fund pursuant to section 36A of the Gaming Machines Act 2001 and section 115B of the Casino Control Act 1992.
  - (b) Forfeiture pursuant to section 20(3)(b) of the Act: for each transfer of 6 GME's 2 shall be forfeited to Liquor & Gaming NSW ("LGNSW"). Furthermore, pursuant to section 20(7) if the proposed GMT increase and transfer of GME's are approved the transferor-hotel's GMT will reduce by the number of entitlements purchased, which would include those forfeited. This will result in a reduction in the number of approved gaming machines in New South Wales.

## THE VENUE

The Venue's SA2, Belmont – Bennetts Green, is classified as a Band 2 area. Neighbouring SA2's within 5 kilometres of the Venue are Valentine – Eleebana (Band 1), Mount Hutton – Windale (Band 3), Redhead (Band 1), Belmont South – Blacksmiths (Band 3), and Swansea – Caves Beach (Band 2), all of which are located within the Lake Macquarie City Council LGA.



The premises is not a new premises as such clause 38 of the Gaming Machines Regulation 2010 does not apply to this application.

The Venue has a total internal floor space of 2,478.56 square metres. The floor plans are included in this application as "Attachment 1", and show the current licensed boundaries, and also the gaming room where all the current and proposed gaming machines shall be located. The gaming room's area is about 77 square metres.

The premises' trading hours are:

- Monday to Saturday: 5:00am – 12:00am and
- Sunday: 10:00am – 10:00pm.

The gaming machine shutdown period is:

- Monday to Sunday and public holidays: 4:00am to 10:00am.

The licence is subject to a minors area authorisation in relation to the lounge bar, restaurant and verandah.

The Venue is a sophisticated establishment that has capacity for accommodation and functions, such as weddings, a family-friendly restaurant with an à la carte menu, and a full bar service with a focus on craft beers, cocktails and wines. The Venue also has other leisure and entertainment-focused facilities available, such as betting, raffle competitions, poker and trivia tournaments, access to Fox Sports on a big screen and gaming. The facilities and services available at the Venue are diverse. The Venue aims to satisfy the needs of all demographics in the local community.

## **THE LOCAL COMMUNITY**

The local community is the Belmont – Bennetts Green SA2.

The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) draws its data from the 2016 Censuses and most notably discloses the following in relation to the SA2:

- the total population is 17,724;
- of the total population 49% is male, which is less than both the state and national average of 49.3%;
- of the total population 51% is female, which is more both the state and national average of 50.7%;
- of the total population 3.3% is of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander descent;
- the median age is 43 years, which is higher than both the state and national median age of 38 years;
- 55.3% of the population work full-time, though this includes persons aged at least 15 years and therefore would likely be attending school rather than being employed in full-time work;
- 33.1% of the population work part-time, which is higher than the state average of 29.7% and the national average of 30.4%. Furthermore, this category included persons of at least 15 years of age;
- the most populous of occupations is Professionals at 18.6%. The second most populous of occupations is Technicians and Trades Workers at 17.9%, which is higher than the state average of 12.7% and the national average of

13.5%. It should be noted that the measurement of employed persons includes those with a minimum age of 15 years.

A copy of the ABS Quick Stats data is attached as “Attachment 2”.

The Census of Population and Housing: Socio-Economic Indexes for Areas (SEIFA), Australia, 2016 was also referred to determine the presence of any socio-economic vulnerability in Belmont – Bennetts Green. The SA2 scored as follows:

1. Index of Relative Socio-economic Advantage and Disadvantage: 1000 (see Fig. 2). ABS notes that a higher score indicates higher advantage and lower disadvantage.<sup>2</sup>
2. Index of Relative Socio-economic Disadvantage: 981 (see Fig. 3). ABS notes that a higher score indicates lower disadvantage.<sup>3</sup>
3. Index of Economic Resources: 1007 (see Fig. 4). ABS notes that a low score indicates a relative lack of access to economic resources.<sup>4</sup>
4. Index of Education and Occupation: 960. ABS notes that a low score indicates relatively lower education and occupation status of people in the area in general.<sup>5</sup>

Confirmation of the SEIFA scores can be seen below in Fig 2.

The fairly high scores show that socio-economic vulnerability is relatively low in Belmont – Bennetts Green. The SEIFA data seems to indicate that although education is comparatively lightly lower, economic resources are higher. This correlates with the presence of an above-average proportion of persons being employed as Technicians and Trades Workers in the SA2.

### **OGILVY REPORT ON PREVALENCE OF GAMBLING AND PROBLEM GAMBLING IN NEW SOUTH WALES (2012) (“REPORT”)**

The Report made numerous findings but of those the most relevant were that:

- the demographic pattern of problem gamblers was more likely to involve men than women (1.4% of men compared with 0.1% of women) and young men (aged 12 – 24) were the most susceptible (2.4%);
- problem gambling was highest amongst single people (1.2% compared to 0.5% of those who were married or living as married);
- problem gambling was also associated with education level - problem gambling being lowest among those with university degrees (0.1%) and highest amongst those who left school before year 10 (2.6%);
- there was also a strong association with employment status, with problem gambling being more than three times higher amongst unemployed people (3.2%) than amongst those in full time work (1.0%). The figure was even lower for part-time workers, students, retirees/pensioners and others.

The ABS data showed that Belmont – Bennetts Green had a higher proportion of females than males in the total population. 51.3% of residents in the SA2 are in a registered marriage, which is distinctly greater than the state average of 48.3% and the national average of 47.7%. Additionally, 9.4% of residents indicated that they were in a de facto marriage. The ABS data did not focus on persons who were “single”, as such, it is difficult to directly compare the report data with the ABS data and to draw reasonable conclusions as to the likelihood of problem gambling in the SA2 in terms of the factor of being single. ABS data did measure people who had “never married” but these included people aged a minimum of 15 years, who lack legal capacity. Furthermore, the ABS data measured people who had been separated (3.0%, compared to 3.1% in New South Wales and 3.2% in Australia) and also those had been widowed (6.8%, compared to 5.4% in New South Wales and 5.2% in Australia): such demographics could either be considered as “single” or not be considered as such.

The report indicated that education was another factor in the presence of problem gambling. The ABS data shows that generally, education is lower than the state and national averages, except in relation to the qualification of Certificate Level IV (3.8% compared to 2.8% in New South Wales and 2.9% in Australia) and Certificate Level

III (19.1% compared to 12% in New South Wales and 12.8% in Australia). This also correlates with the earlier observation that there is an above-average proportion of persons employed as Technicians and Trades Workers in Belmont – Bennetts Green. Technicians and trades workers are fairly high earners and, for example, according to Payscale, electricians can earn an annual salary of around \$99,769.00,<sup>7</sup> while plumbers can earn an annual salary of around \$89,378.00<sup>8</sup>. Based on these examples, though education may indicate the possibility of disadvantage in the local community any such possible disadvantage would be offset by the residents' earning capacities. Furthermore, persons aged at least 15 years and retirees have been incorrectly taken into consideration in these statistics. Persons aged at least 15 years may still be attending school and therefore not eligible or not yet willing to obtain a tertiary qualification, or in relation to young adults, they could be in the midst of obtaining a tertiary qualification and therefore cannot identify themselves as holding such a qualification yet. The incorrect consideration, or failure to clarify the existence, of such persons would have resulted in an artificially reduced representation of persons who have attained tertiary education.

There are above-average proportions of persons engaged in unpaid domestic work (73%, compared with 67.7% in New South Wales and 69% in Australia), childcare (31.6% compared with 27.2% in New South Wales and 27.6% in Australia), unpaid assistance to disabled persons (13.3% compared with 11.6% in New South Wales and 11.3% in Australia) or voluntary work (18.5% compared with 18.1% in New South Wales and 19% in Australia). The amount of people who perform unpaid work is notable in Belmont – Bennetts Green and illustrates that the absence of persons involved in specific occupations or industries does not automatically equate with socio-economic disadvantage or vulnerability.

## **HARM MINIMISATION AND RESPONSIBLE GAMBLING MEASURES**

The primary purpose of the business carried out at the Venue is the sale of liquor by retail. The keeping and operation of gaming machines does not detract unduly from the character of the Venue or from the enjoyment of patrons, particularly in light of the Services available, particularly in light of the diverse range of facilities and services available at the Venue and detailed above under the section titled "The Venue". The harm minimisation measures and responsible gambling practices and measures summarised in the Executive Summary are elaborated as follows:

- a) Gaming machines are provided within a designated gaming room within the Venue located in a bar area of the Venue;
- b) physically separated from the general bar area by permanent walls with at least the bottom half of such wall being constructed of opaque material;

- c) situated such that patrons are not compelled to pass through the gaming room in order to enter or leave the Venue or to gain access to another part of the Venue and situated such that gaming machines cannot be seen from any place outside the Venue;
- d) available to enter free of charge;
- e) set up so that machines are suitably spaced;
- f) there is a doorway or space that provides access to an operating bar and bathroom for each gender without the need for patrons to leave the Venue;
- g) cannot be viewed from a public street; and
- h) monitored by CCTV, the Applicant and gaming attendant employees.
- i) The Applicant and gaming attendant employees supervise the gaming room enabling them to detect any possible signs of problem gambling in patrons;
- j) the Applicant and staff involved with gaming hold a current Responsible Conduct of Gambling qualification;
- k) the Venue provides a self-exclusion scheme to patrons on request. The self-exclusion scheme is offered through GameCare – operated by AHA (NSW);
- l) the name and contact details of a gambling help counselling service is available in the gaming room at all times to patrons and each self-exclusion scheme participant;
- m) a statement advising patrons that a self-exclusion scheme is available and the name and contact details of GameCare who is able to assist patrons with becoming a participant in the scheme conducted by the Venue is displayed in the gaming room;
- n) all prescribed signage is displayed including display of information concerning chances of winning, the dangers of gambling and counselling services;
- o) brochures are displayed, including in community languages, informing patrons of the potential dangers of gambling, the availability of counselling and self-exclusion scheme;
- p) no ATM is located in the gaming room and patrons are not permitted to make withdrawals on credit;
- q) the Venue does not advise or promote the availability of gaming machines at the Venue or at all;
- r) clocks are visible to all patrons in the gaming room and set to and accurately reflect the correct time;
- s) the Venue does not accept third party cheques nor permits the cashing of cheques;
- t) the Venue limits cash payment of winnings to \$5,000.00;
- u) minors are not permitted to access the gaming room and for the avoidance of any doubt, prohibited from operating gaming machines;
- v) prize winning cheques are clearly identified as prize winning cheques;
- w) complies with the gaming machine shutdown hours endorsed on its licence.
- x) all gaming machines kept at the Venue are approved gaming machines and are connected to an authorized CMS;
- y) gaming related signs are not visible from the outside of the Venue and are situated within the Venue;
- z) no inducements are offered for the use of gaming machines at the Venue; and
- aa) mandatory gaming machine shutdown.



The harm minimisation measures and responsible gambling practices and measures currently in place at the Venue are extensive, detailed and the product of the business owner's extensive experience in operating hotels in New South Wales, as such, they are tried and proven measures and practices that ensure that patrons who choose to utilise the gaming machines are able to make informed decisions about participating in gambling, minimise the potential for and incidence of harm associated with gambling, and reducing the incidence and prevalence of problem gambling.

### **POSITIVE CONTRIBUTION – S 36(3)(c)(i)**

#### *Financial contribution*

The primary positive contribution shall be made by way of a financial contribution of \$645,505.05 if this application is approved. The proposed contribution shall be made to the Secretary of the Responsible Gambling Fund pursuant to section 36A of the Gaming Machines Act 2001 and section 115B of the Casino Control Act 1992.

#### Calculation of amount of financial contribution

The amount of the financial contribution was calculated in accordance with the new formula set out in GL4014 Class 1 Local Impact Assessment process guidelines published by the Independent Liquor & Gaming Authority, that is, 15% of the average profit of the existing machines in the Venue, multiplied by the number of proposed additional GME's, and multiplied by the number of years over which the contribution can be paid (i.e. 5 years). The average profits were calculated from 12 months of gaming performance data (see Attachment 3).

#### *Additional positive contribution*

The second positive contribution which this application will have if it is approved is forfeiture of two GME's for every block of 6 GME's pursuant to section 20(3)(b) of the Gaming Machines Act 2001 ("the Act"). Furthermore, pursuant to section 20(7) of the Act if the proposed GMT increase and transfer of GME's are approved the transferor-hotel's GMT will reduce by the number of entitlements purchased, which would include those forfeited. Therefore the operation of sections 20(3)(b) and 20(7) of the Act will result in a reduction in the number of approved gaming machines in New South Wales.

### **SUBMISSIONS FROM STAKEHOLDERS**

The Applicant is unaware of any specific community concerns but in the event any arise following advertising and notification requirements associated with the Application they will be addressed at that time.

## **CONCLUSION**

The Applicant submits that this Class 1 LIA accompanying the 'low range' Application satisfies the requirements of section 36(3) of the GMA, applicable regulations and guidelines for the Authority to approve the application.

### **Section 36(3)(a) and (b)**

The applicant submits that this LIA complies with the requirements of the Division and the regulations in relation to a class 1 LIA, and further submits that this LIA demonstrates that gambling activities in the Venue will be conducted responsibly.

### **Section 36(3)(c)(i)**

The proposed increase in the gaming machine threshold will provide a positive contribution towards the local community where the venue is situated on the basis of the applicant's proposed financial contribution to be paid in accordance with section 36A of the Act.

### **Section 36(3)(c)(ii)**

The Venue is not a new hotel or new club premises, accordingly, the question of whether the Venue is located in the immediate vicinity of a school, hospital or place of public worship is not a factor that should be considered in this circumstance. However, the applicant acknowledges that there is no such school, hospital or place of public worship that is in the immediate vicinity of the Venue.

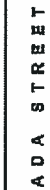
### **Section 36(3)(c)(iii)**

Regulation 37 of the GMR sets out pre-application consultation requirements but also provides that the provision is applicable only to a class 2 LIA. As explained in the Introduction (page 3 of this LIA) on the basis that the Venue is situated in a Band 2 LGA and is seeking a low increase of its GMT, it was determined that a class 1 LIA was appropriate rather than a class 2 LIA. Therefore, we submit that reg. 37 is not applicable to this application.

Regulation 41 of the GMR provides for post-application consultation requirements. Each of these will be complied with.

Accordingly, the Applicant respectfully submits that as the elements for a LIA Class 1 are met the Application should be approved.

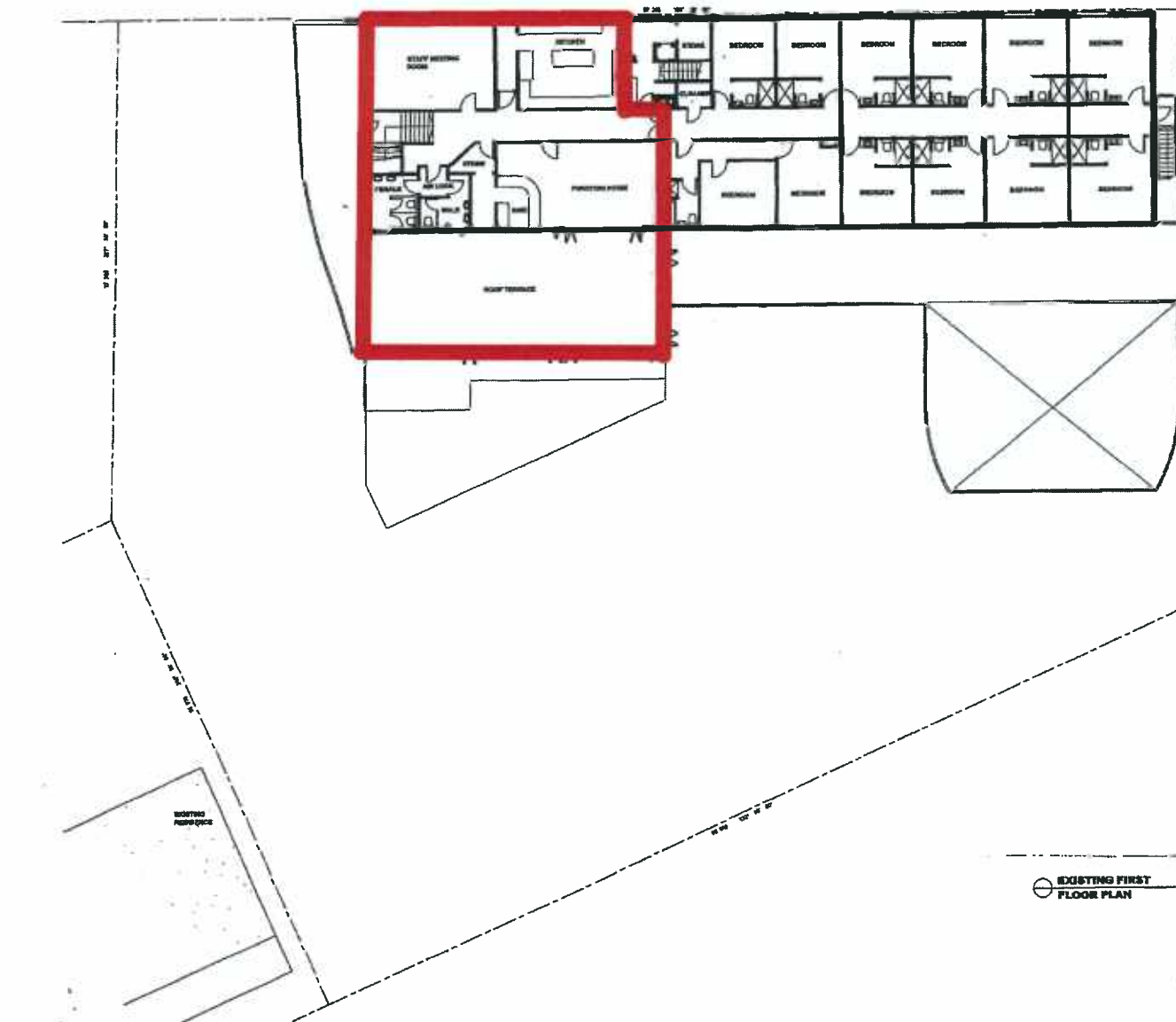
