Decision of the Independent Liquor & Gaming Authority Application for a change of conditions - Gaming machine shutdown hours – Captain Cook Hotel

We refuse the application under section 42(3) of the Gaming Machines Act 2001.

Statement of reasons

Overall, we are concerned that the social impact of approving the application is likely to be detrimental to the well-being of the local or broader community.

We note that the proposal is seeking to increase the availability of post-midnight gaming at the venue from 12 hours to 24 hours per week of which 12 hours will be during the higher risk period of post 2 AM.

Our findings

Procedural requirements

The Authority is satisfied that the hotelier holds a recognised competency card with a current RCG endorsement.

Community impact

Local and broader communities

The relevant 'local community' is the suburb of Botany, and the relevant 'broader community' comprises the Local Government Area of Bayside.

Office of Responsible Gambling identified risk factors

The Office of Responsible Gambling (ORG) has identified a number of problem gaming risk indicators for local areas and recommend proceeding with caution in cases where these exceed NSW average figures. The following risk indicators have been identified for the Bayside LGA:

- proportion of the total population aged 20-24 years is above the NSW average
- proportion of the population who speak a language other than English at home is above the NSW average
- proportion of lone person households is above NSW average.

Findings of concern

We are concerned that if the application were granted it may increase the harm associated with the misuse and abuse of gambling activities or fail to facilitate the balanced development, in the public interest, of the gaming industry due to:

- the proposed increase of post-midnight and post 2AM gaming at the venue
- the ORG risk factors as outlined above
- the venue being located in an area of average problem gambling prevalence

The risks may be mitigated by the:

- the venue's proposed gaming plan of management (GPOM) having been assessed as exceeding the Authority's standards for a venue of this type
- venue being located in a Band 1 (low risk) SA2
- venue showing lower than average levels of gaming intensity when compared to the SA2 and LGA

However, on balance, we are concerned that the likelihood of adverse social impact from approving the application outweighs any benefit to the local or broader community and accordingly, approval of the application is not in the public interest.
