

Extended trading authorisation

If an extended trading authorisation for retail consumption on premises liquor trading times (up to 2:00am) is required, please ensure that council approval is firstly in place for the requested liquor trading times, prior to completing the relevant application. The licence will be subject to a 6-hour closure period, which is a continuous block of time in each 24-hour period, during which the licence must not sell/supply liquor. The period cannot start any earlier than 12:00am. Standard trading hours are affected by the 6-hour closure period. The Authority will approve a period that is appropriate to the particular premises and the circumstances, having regard to the objectives of the *Liquor Act 2007*.
