Decision of the Independent Liquor & Gaming Authority

Application for a GMT increase and a GME transfer – Strathfield Recreation Club Limited

We refuse the application under section 34 of the Gaming Machines Act 2001.

Statement of reasons

Overall, we are concerned that the social impact of approving the application may be detrimental to the well-being of the local or broader community.

Our findings

Procedural requirements

We are satisfied that the secretary of the club holds a recognised competency card with a current RCG endorsement.

Community impact

Local and broader communities

The relevant 'local community' is the community in the suburb of Strathfield, and the relevant 'broader community' comprises the Local Government Area of Burwood.

Office of Responsible Gambling identified risk factors

The Office of Responsible Gambling (ORG) has identified a number of problem gaming risk indicators for local areas and recommend proceeding with caution in cases where these exceed NSW average figures. The following risk indicators have been identified for the Burwood LGA:

- the proportion of population aged 20-24 is almost double the NSW average
- the proportion of the population who speak a language other than English at home is double the NSW average

Findings of concern

We note that we refused the same application at our meeting on 12 October 2023 and that the venue submitted a new application with a revised Gaming Plan of Management (GPOM). We appreciate the letter sent by the Club's General Manager as part of the application and note that further harm minimisation measures have been implemented since the last decision was made. We also reviewed the statements provided by the two selling clubs, Oxley Bowling Club & Edgeworth Bowling Club Co-operative Limited outlining their positions.

Our concerns remain the same as outlined in our Statement of Reasons dated 29 November 2023. We are particularly concerned about the venue's availability of 28 hours of post-midnight gaming, with 14 hours of these during the higher risk post-2AM period. The area has high rates of at-risk gamblers compared to the NSW average and the venue's high profitability per electronic gaming machine is indicative of high gaming intensity and associated risk of gaming harm.

While we recognise some improvement in the GPOM, we consider that this, and any conditions that might be imposed, would not effectively mitigate the high risks presented.
