# Under delegation issued by the Independent Liquor and Gaming Authority under section 13 of the *Gaming and Liquor Administration Act 2007*, **an authorised person** of Liquor & Gaming NSW, has **considered** the application: **Producer Wholesaler Liquor Licence with Drink on premises authorisation** (DOPA) – Parkes Brewhouse

I have determined to approve the application under the Liquor Act 2007 (Act) — with the conditions set out in Schedule 1.

# **Statement of reasons**

Having reviewed all the material, I am satisfied under section 48(3) of the Act that the overall impact of approving the application will not be detrimental to the well-being of the local or broader community.

# Main findings

## Impacted communities

For the purposes of this decision the local community is the suburb of Parkes. The broader community is the Local Government Area (LGA) of Parkes.

## Analysis of Submissions and statutory requirements

- 1. Appropriate consent is in place for the use of the premises for use as a producer wholesaler liquor licence with drink on premises authorisation.
- 2. Council advised that they have no objection to the application.
- 3. A Police submission was received and considered as summarised: No objections, conditions requested
- 4. I am satisfied that the applicant has been provided with an opportunity to consider and comment upon the conditions contained in the licence document.
- 5. I am satisfied that all other statutory requirements have been met.

## Positive social impacts

I am satisfied that the proposal would benefit the local and broader communities.

The Brewhouse Parkes is a craft microbrewery with a tasting area, additionally licenced to offer the sales of our beer and cider, as well as a selection of wines, accompanied by food. The granting of the licence will provide patrons with increased choice to socialise, including to enjoy a meal and/or a social drink with the licence within the suburb of Parkes.

#### **Negative social impacts**

I accept that the proposal could contribute to an increase in alcohol-related harm in the local and broader communities.

I am satisfied that the business model, conditions imposed, and any other information contained in the application will ensure that the lawful operation of the premises will not be detrimental to the local or broader community.

In particular, the Plan of Management and licence conditions will serve to mitigate any potential negative impacts.

## The material that was considered

I considered the following material when making a decision:

- the application material including evidence that stakeholders and the community were notified about the application
- the plan of the licensed premises and any authorisations
- a plan of management for the licensed business
- a development consent for the premises
- stakeholder submissions and the applicant's response to them.

This decision will be published in accordance with section 36C of the *Gaming and Liquor Administration Act* 2007.

## **Opportunity for review**

The applicant and anyone who was notified of the application and made a submission, may apply to <u>ILGA</u> for a review of the decision.

An application for review must be made no later 28 days after the decision is published on the website (<u>ILGA</u>). There is a fee to lodge the application.

5.	Crime Scene Preservation	
	Immediately after the person in charge of the licensed premises or a staff member becomes aware of any incident involving an act of violence causing injury to a person on the premises, the person in charge of the licensed premises and/or staff member must:	
	<ol> <li>1) take all practical steps to preserve and keep intact the area where the act of violence occurred,</li> </ol>	
	2) retain all material and implements associated with the act of violence in accordance with the crime scene preservation guidelines issued by NSW Police, as published from time to time on the Liquor & Gaming NSW website.	
	3) 3) Make direct and personal contact with NSW Police to advise it of the incident, and	
	4) 4) Comply with any directions given by NSW Police to preserve or keep intact the area where the violence occurred.	
	In this condition, 'staff member' means any person employed by, or acting on behalf of, the licensee of the premises, and includes any person who is employed to carry on security activities (e.g. Crowd controller or bouncer) on or about the premises.
