I am writing in accordance with the invitation for submissions in relation to the above subject matter. As an owner and resident in Potts Point I am:

1. Opposed to any relaxation of existing rules relating to liquor licence applications
2. Would like to see both Category A and B combined to the broadest consultation particularly as it concerns residents and the broader community

In the last 12 months, I do not recall having received any notifications for liquor licence applications in the area although the web site indicates that there have been a number of Category A and B applications. I believe this is mainly because the applications have been for premises greater than 100m from my residence. This distance is totally inadequate as we know that patrons of these venues will likely cover a radius greater than 100m to attend these venues and the impacts of serving alcohol and the trading hours for selling alcohol are felt in the broader community outside of the 100m distance.

This is particularly the case in inner city areas where you have a layering effect of alcohol service across wine bars, restaurants, pubs and clubs.

We are vehemently opposed to any relaxation of Liquor Licence processes and would like to see broader community consultation.
