

MEETING OUTCOME

A statutory board established under the Gaming and Liquor Administration Act 2007

The Independent Liquor & Gaming Authority (ILGA) held a meeting of its Liquor & Gaming Committee on **Wednesday**, **18 May 2022** to consider, among other things, applications under the *Gaming and Liquor Administration Act 2007, Liquor Act 2007, Gaming Machines Act 2001* and the *Registered Clubs Act 1976*. The next ILGA Liquor & Gaming Committee meeting is scheduled for **Monday**, **30 May 2022**.

Definitions:
