Mandated liquor law signs:

Sign 1L Under 18s not to be served alcohol – all premises



No alcohol can be sold or supplied to anyone under 18. It's against the law.

Sign 2L Bar and gaming machine areas of hotels and clubs

Sign 3L Under 18s authorisation sign hotels and public entertainment venues

Sign 4L Breath testing sign – venues with breath analysis machines

NSW NSW Important information about breath testing

Readings given by this instrument are not accepted by Police or the Courts.

Your blood alcohol level can rise for 1 hour or more after your last drink.

Mandated liquor law signs:

Sign 6L – small bars (unless authorised)

No one under 18 is allowed on these premises during liquor trading hours. It's against the law.

JNDER No one under 18 is allowed on these premises during liquor trading hours. It's against the law.

Mandated liquor law signs:

Sign 7L – small bars (if authorised)

Minors allowed on premises until ... as long as they are with a responsible adult.



Mandated liquor law signs:

Sign 8L – small bars (if authorised)

Minors are allowed on the premises until ...





Notice for online / web-based liquor businesses

Old wording (acceptable until 18 July 2021):

New wording (mandatory from 19 July 2021):

- Liquor Act 2007 It is against the law to sell or supply alcohol to, or to obtain alcohol on behalf of, a person under the age of 18 years.
- No Alcohol can be sold or supplied to anyone under 18. It's against the law.

Mandated registered club signs:

Sign 1C Guests Register - minors not to sign



Current

Members are not permitted to sign in any guest under 18. It's against the law.

Non-mandated liquor signs:

No Entry or Re-entry after 1.30am decal

Current

No entry or re-entry after 1:30am

By law, this venue is not allowed to admit patrons after 1:30am. Penalties apply.

A5 sticker - Tough measures in place for under 18s who try to buy alcohol here

Tough penalties for buying alcohol if you're under 18

On-the-spot fine of \$220
Court appearance + \$2,200 fine
Extra 6 months on your P plates
It's not worth the <u>risk</u>



UNDER 25?

Be prepared to show ID

The ONLY acceptable forms of evidence of age in NSW are a current: Driver or rider licence or permit issued in Australia or another country NSW Digital Driver Licence · Australian or other passport · NSW photo card · Proof of age card (issued by an Australian state or territory except NSW)











NSW

If you're under 18, you can be fined up to \$2,200 if you enter a venue illegally or obtain/consume alcohol



UNDER 25?

Be ready to show photo ID to prove you are over 18 on entry or when buying alcohol at this venue

Fines of up to \$2,200 can apply

Note: Only the Keypas (over 18) identity card



Non-mandated liquor signs:

A4 Sticker - It's not worth the risk - refuse to sell

Refuse to sell to under 18s

If you sell alcohol to a minor, this venue's liquor licence can be suspended or cancelled. Plus, your RSA competency card can be suspended or revoked.
