

REGULATORY PRIORITIES 2017 – 2018

Liquor & Gaming NSW (L&GNSW) reviews its regulatory priorities annually assisted by consultation with key liquor and gaming industry and community stakeholders. Regulatory priorities are set in the context of NSW Government priorities, and Liquor & Gaming NSW's Strategic Plan, and are informed by an assessment of existing, new or emerging issues and their potential impact on regulatory outcomes, community safety and industry sustainability.

Enduring priorities

Some forms of conduct are so fundamental to meeting community expectations and ensuring safe and responsible liquor and gaming industries that L&GNSW maintains a constant focus. These include:

- Conduct leading to or likely to contribute to significant alcohol or gambling-related harm
- Unlicensed sale of alcohol
- Sale or supply of alcohol to minors
- Criminal influence within the casino sector

Priorities 2017-2018

In addition to the enduring priorities, L&GNSW will prioritise its work as follows for 2017-2018.

Our priorities during this period are:



Liquor

Priority 1: Targeted oversight of higher risk venues, precincts, displacement areas and regional locations

Priority 2: Addressing compliance in emerging and at-risk business models

Priority 3: High risk indicators within the packaged liquor sector including online and delivery



Clubs

Priority 7: Ensuring clubs are effectively governed



Gaming & Wagering

Priority 4: Gambling-related advertising and inducements

Priority 5: Sports betting integrity arrangements

Priority 6: Gaming machine integrity and custody arrangements



Casino

Priority 8: International rebate play/junkets/Anti-Money Laundering

Priority 9: Internal controls and systems integrity and revenue assurance
