



The Independent Liquor and Gaming Authority (ILGA) held a board meeting on **Wednesday, 12 September 2018** to consider, among other things, applications under the *Gaming and Liquor Administration Act 2007*, *Casino Control Act 1992*, *Liquor Act 2007*, *Gaming Machines Act 2001* and *Registered Clubs Act 1976*. The next ILGA board meeting is scheduled for **Wednesday, 17 October 2018**.
