Use this application form if the gaming machine shutdown period for your licensed premises is the general 6-hour shutdown period from 4:00AM to 10:00AM each day of the week, and if you are applying to reduce that period to the 3-hour period from 6:00AM to 9:00AM on each day of the week (including Saturdays and Sundays).

What you need to know

If you will be increasing the availability of gaming after midnight you may be captured by Guideline 16 - Late-night gaming applications, which sets out additional factors that the Independent Liquor & Gaming Authority may consider when reviewing applications involving late-night gaming.

Apply only if:

- the licensee had before 26 July 2001 entered into a contract for major building works in respect of the licensed premises, and that decision was based on cash flow estimates from trading hours that did not include a 6-hour shutdown period; or
- ▲ hardship was caused by a decline in business revenue or a loss of jobs that were a direct result of the requirement initially for a 3-hour and later for a 6-hour shutdown period; or
- other hardship can be demonstrated to the satisfaction of the decision maker.

A compulsory 6-hour shutdown period applies to all club and hotel licences that keep gaming machines. Gaming machines must not be played during the shutdown period. The general shutdown period commences at 4:00AM and concludes at 10:00AM each day.

A club or hotel can apply for approval of a 3-hour shutdown period on each day of the week. If approved, gaming machines must not be played during the 3-hour shutdown period commencing at 6:00AM and concluding at 9:00AM each day.

Approval will only be given where:

- The financial viability of the business as a whole will be seriously threatened if approval is not given
- There has been a clear loss of revenue since introduction of the 3-hour shutdown period requirement on 2 April 2002 or the 6-hour shutdown period requirement on 1 May 2003
- There will be a significant continuing downturn in revenue if approval is not given to this application
- ✓ There has been a clear reduction in the number of permanent staff employed or hours worked by casual or part-time staff since 2 April 2002
- There will be a clear reduction in the number of permanent staff employed or hours worked by casual or part-time staff if approval is not given
- The club or hotel would have a significant continuing downturn in the level of support given to the local community, either through direct funding or through 'in-kind' services provided to local community groups, if approval is not given
- The club or hotel had entered into a contract prior to 26 July 2001 for carrying out significant building or refurbishment work, and the decision to enter into the contract was based on cash flow estimates at that time which relied on the trading hours of the premises remaining unchanged.
