R.C.G. POLICY

RESPONSIBLE CONDUCT OF GAMING (RCG)

The Directors, Management and Staff of Wagga RSL Club are committed to the Responsible Conduct of Gaming services. This includes:

The legislative framework for responsible conduct of gambling in Registered Clubs in New South Wales is provided by the Gambling Legislation Amendment (responsible Gambling) Act 1999, the Registered Clubs Act 1976, the Gaming Machines Act 2001 and accompanying regulations. Wagga RSL Club discharges all statutory obligations, specifically:

- Providing information to members and their guests on counselling services
- Providing specific consumer information. This includes:
 - ~ Chance of winning notices
 - ~ Gaming machines notice of the dangers of gambling
 - ~ Player information brochures
 - ~ Automatic teller machine signage
- Ensuring that all signs on gaming machines and automatic telling machines have not been removed or defaced
- Not cashing third party cheques
- Not offering gambling inducements
- Not providing cash prizes in poker machine promotions
- Limiting the prize value of poker machine promotions to \$1,000
- Not engaging in gaming machine advertising off the premises
- Ensuring that there is no external gaming machine signage and that any internal signage can not be seen from outside the venue
- Producing player activity statements
- Operating a self-exclusion scheme
- Maintaining links with a problem gambling counselling service
- Enforcing the law relating to cheque cashing facilities, credit gambling and the location of automatic teller machines
- Paying any prizes won on a gaming machine, over the value of \$2,000 by cheque
- Enforcing laws prohibiting minors from being involved in gambling activities
- Installing clocks in gaming areas to provide a reality check to players
- Ensuring designated employees complete an approved course in Responsible Conduct of Gambling
- Applying of Responsible Conduct of Gambling policies to TAB and Keno areas
- Wagga RSL Club also participates in the ClubSafe program




Local Community Map





Layout of Venue

Who are we?

Willans Hill School is a large regional Special School. We cater for the educational needs of over 60 students with moderate and severe intellectual and physical disabilities.

The Bus

In 2005 our school lost some valuable funding. This meant that we could not purchase a wheel chair accessible vehicle to enable our students to access the community. Wagga RSL heard about our funding plight and offered to lease a bus on our behalf. Our beautifully modified bus arrived on the 22^{nd} September,2005.

I have attached a copy of our newsletter from this date.

This bus enables one class of students, including two students in wheelchairs, to access work experience, swimming programs, community orientation programs, environmental education programs, and much, much more. It can be driven by anyone with a normal driver's license.

Wagga RSL's Commitment

The contract called for 48 monthly repayments at \$1,200 per month.

It is now reaching the end of the contract.

Wagga RSL has now kindly offered to pay out the residual on the bus. This is extremely generous as the amount is approximately \$23,000.

This will mean that our school community will own this wonderful resource.

Without this generous support our students would not be able to access their own community.

We will forever be grateful for this kindness.



ANZAC Avenue will receive a well-deserved facelift over the next three years as part of the City Partnership Project.

Wagga City Council and foundation City Partner Wagga RSL Club announced the upgrade yesterday, to be completed ahead of the 100-year anniversary of Gallipoli.

"This upgrade has been planned by Council to restore the avenue in preparation for the 100th anniversary of Gallipoli in 2015 – an anniversary that will be a great source of pride for the city and nation," mayor Kerry Pascoe said.

Wagga RSL will contribute \$45,000 over three years to assist fast-tracking of the project.

"Wagga RSL Club is very pleased to be involved in such a great project as part of the City Partnership Program," RSL president John Keyes said.

RSL general manager Andrew Bell said that this fits perfectly with the Club.

"It was approved at last month's board meeting. It was a unanimous verdict and everyone loved the idea," he said.

The first phase of the upgrade involves the removal of the existing aged and damaged poplar trees along Morrow Street and The Esplanade and replacing them with 250 advanced poplar P. simoni.

Restoration work will also be carried out on the cenotaph and its surrounds for improved lighting, visibility and access to the memorial.

The new trees will be planted alongside the footpath on the northern side of Morrow Street, around Ivan Jack Drive and along The Esplanade to the Beckwith Street bridge.

The planting has been scheduled to begin at the optimum poplar planting time of mid-winter, with half the trees being planted this year and the remaining trees to be put in next winter.

The replacement trees, which will come at a cost of \$27,000, are more suited to the environment and are more likely to thrive without characteristics normally associated with poplars, such as vigorous suckering.

The poplar P. simoni can be found along Baylis Street intersections and have proved they can weather Wagga conditions.

Wagga City Council and the RSL are also calling for information from the public about the names of the 350 diggers whose plaques were on the original trees, so they can be remembered on the new poplars.

Wagga Wagga City Council and Foundation City Partner, Wagga RSL Club today announced the upgrade of Anzac Avenue is their selected City Partnership Project. This multi-year project will see the upgrade of the important memorial ahead of the 100 year Anniversary of Gallipoli in 2015.

Wagga RSL will contribute \$15,000 per year for three years to assist Wagga City Council fast-track and add value to an identified Council project that will restore a treasured community memorial.

President of the Wagga RSL Board of Directors, Mr John Keyes, said the project was a natural fit with the Wagga RSL Club's origins

This great community project allows us to work with the Council to restore the avenue to former glories, and serve as a monument well into the future." he continued. "Wagge RSL Club is very pleased to be involved such a great project as part of the City Partnership Program."

Wagga Wagga Mayor, Kerry Pascoe, said, "This upgrade has been planned by Council to restore the Avenue in preparation for the 100th Anniversary of Gallipoli in 2015 - an anniversary that will be a great source of pride for the City and nation."

It is anticipated that the project will begin in July 2009, and will consist of the following components to take place over the next three years

Existing poplar removal from Anzac Avenue along Morrow Street and The Esplanade

Planting 250 advanced Poplar P. simoni alongside the footpath on the northern side of Morrow Street, around Ivan Jack Drive, and along The Esplanade to the Beckwith Street Bridge

- Restoration work to the Cenotaph and surrounds
- Improved lighting and landscaping around the corner of Baylis and Norrow Streets to improve visibility and access to Cenotaph.

During the first phase of the project, existing Poplars planted along the Avenue will be removed as they are aged and damaged, limiting their ability to cope with climate conditions they are not naturally accustomed to.

Replacement trees, the Poplar P. simoni, have been selected as they are more suited to the environment and more likely to thrive, without the troublesome characteristics normally associated with Poplars, such as vigorous suckering

The Poplar P. simoni is already planted at the intersections of Baylis Street, and has proven it can successfully flourish in the Wagga Wagga area

Wagga RSL Club were announced as Foundation Partnership launch in February, and since then have been working with Wagga City Council to select a community project that will improve infrastructure within the Local Government Area and align with their organisational vision and mission The City Partnership Program was launched by Council as a framework for community-minded businesses to partner with Wagga Wagga City Council to provide additional resources and infrastructure to residents and visitors of the City
