#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

**ES1:** This Class 1 Local Impact Assessment (LIA) supports an application by Knightsbridge Estate Group Pty Ltd (The Applicant) for a Gaming Machine Threshold (GMT) increase for the Williamtown Hotel Licence No LIQH440018945, to be constructed at 2 Lavis Lane, Williamtown. The hotel premises are due to commence construction in 2014. Internal floor space of the hotel will be 890m<sup>2</sup>.

**ES2:** Williamtown Hotel is a newly-granted hotel licence. The Applicant seeks a GMT increase of thirty (30) hotel Poker Machine Permits. The Applicant acknowledges that should the total number of PMPs subject of this application not be taken up within two years, the GMT for the premises will revert to the number of PMPs then held.

**ES3:** The Hotel is located in the Port Stephens Council Local Government Area (LGA). Port Stephens is categorised as a Band 1 LGA under the current Office of Liquor Gaming and Racing (OLGR) classifications.

**ES4:** There are no notifiable premises located within 200 metres of the hotel site. The nearest such premises, St Saviour's Anglican Church, is estimated to be 235 metres from the hotel. One religious service is held each Sunday, and this concluded prior to the approved operating hours for the hotel.

**ES5:** There are no other publicly-accessible hotels or clubs in Williamtown. The establishment of the hotel is expected to be beneficial to the community to the extent that it provides services that residents may presently need to travel to other locales to access. In this respect the availability of the hotel may play a part in reducing risks associated with any such current activity. This amenity benefit to the Williamtown community is also expected to extend to the increasing number of visitors to the area, particularly those associated with Newcastle Airport and associated commercial activity.

**ES6:** In addition to the amenity improvement noted in ES5, the hotel will provide financial and in-kind support to local organisations such as Medowie RUFC, Medowie Soccer Club, Rural Fire Service Medowie/Soldiers Point/Tanilba Bay, State Emergency Service Port Stephens and the Rotary Club of Williamtown, upon application from these organisations. The hotel will also participate in occasional charitable fundraising in the community as this eventuates.

**ES7:** The Applicant will favourably consider employment applications from suitably qualified and experienced applicants who reside in Williamtown or immediate areas, when engaging staff.

**ES8:** In view of the matters in ES5 and ES6, it is expected that the hotel will make an overall positive contribution to the local community.

**ES9:** The hotel will comply with all statutory requirements and industry standards in respect of the Responsible Conduct of Gambling on the premises. The Applicant will join and participate in the Port Stephens/Raymond Terrace Liquor Accord and will seek to engage with local problem gambling services providers to develop an effective risk management strategy in respect of the hotel's gaming operations.

**ES10:** Statutorily-required and additional local consultation in respect of the hotel licence application (2012) included disclosure of the installation of EGMs. No objection to the proposed gaming activity was recorded during those consultations.

#### 1. SCOPE OF APPLICATION

This Class 1 Local Impact Assessment (LIA) supports an application for an increase in the Gaming Machine Threshold (GMT) of thirty (30) Poker Machine Permits (PMPs) for the Williamtown Hotel, to be situated in Williamtown NSW.

### 2. APPLICANT & LICENCE INFORMATION

#### 2.1 Premises details

The application relates to a yet-to-be constructed hotel, situated at 2 Lavis Lane (corner of Nelson Bay Road), Williamtown NSW. The hotel is to be called the Williamtown Hotel. Hotel Licence No. LIQH440018945 was granted in respect of the hotel by the Independent Liquor & Gaming Authority (the Authority) on 29 August 2013. The hotel will have an internal floor space of 890m<sup>2</sup>.

Williamtown is situated in the Port Stephens Local Government Area. Under the Office of Liquor, Gaming and Racing (OLGR) LGA classification current at November 2013, Port Stephens is categorised as a Band 1 LGA. As a consequence, this GMT increase application is subject of a Class 1 LIA.

The Applicant acknowledges that should the total number of PMPs subject of this application not be taken up within two years, the GMT for the premises will revert to the number of PMPs then held.

# 2.2 Applicant/Approved Manager Details

The Applicant for this GMT increase is Knightsbridge Estate Group Pty Ltd, the Licensee of the Williamtown Hotel, under the Liquor Licence detailed in Section 2.1. The Authority further recorded the appointment of David Raymond Gaddes as the Approved Manager of the Williamtown Hotel, approval number LIQXA911014242.

# 3. LOCATION OF NOTIFIABLE PREMISES IN VICINITY

There are no schools, places of public worship or hospitals within 200 metres of the proposed site for the Williamtown Hotel. The nearest such premises is St Saviour's Anglican Church, situated on Cabbage Tree Road, Williamtown.

The nearest point of the church site boundary has been measured as being 235 metres from the nearest point of the proposed hotel site<sup>1</sup>. A diagram of the site and the attendant measurement to the church is included at Appendix 1.

The church is part of the Williamtown/Medowie/Mallabula parish. Services are conducted at the church at 8.00am on Sundays. Subsequent services in the parish are conducted at 9.15am at Mallabula or 9.30am at Medowie on alternative Sundays, indicating that services at Williamtown are completed well before the proposed Sunday opening time for the hotel of 10.00am. As a result no impact on worshippers is anticipated as a consequence of the hotel's trading activities.

#### 4. BENEFITS TO THE COMMUNITY OF ADDITIONAL PMPs

The establishment of a hotel offering a full range of liquor licence-related services is expected to improve the amenity of the Williamtown community and that of the increasing number of visitors to the area. This is particularly the case in relation to activity related to Newcastle Airport, at which operations and passenger numbers are expanding rapidly. As there are no equivalent premises in Williamtown at present, the hotel will allow residents to access such a facility, without increased risk associated with travel to and from other localities to access such a facility. The inclusion of gaming facilities will contribute to the viability of the hotel and the total range of services it will provide, ensuring its continued availability to the community.

The Applicant will favourably consider employment applications from suitably qualified and experienced applicants who reside in Williamtown or immediate areas, when engaging staff.

Once the hotel is operational, the Applicant will seek to provide financial (sponsorship) and inkind (meeting facilities, fund raising prizes etc.) to local organisations such as sporting clubs (e.g. Medowie RUFC; Medowie Soccer Club) and community groups (e.g. Rural Fire Service Medowie/Soldiers Point/Tanilba Bay; State Emergency Service Port Stephens; Rotary Club of Williamtown), upon application from such groups. The hotel will also participate in occasional charitable fundraising in the community as this eventuates. These contributions are not quantified in this LIA, as the hotel is not currently operational, and the contributions will clearly be relative to the commercial performance of the hotel.

On these bases, the premises will make a positive contribution to the local community by providing convenient access to services that were previously only available in other locales. This will repatriate relevant commercial activity to the localised community and allow beneficial redistribution of a proportion of the proceeds of this activity to local community groups.

#### 5. HARM MINIMISATION AND RCG MEASURES IN PREMISES

The internal layout of the premises will be designed to separate the gaming machine area from the proposed dining area, for which a minors' area authorisation will be sought. The premises layout will also minimise the visibility of the gaming machine area from public areas outside the hotel building.

The Licensee will conduct all gaming activities within the obligations of the *Act* and Regulations. This will include the employment of hotel and shift management personnel with significant experience in the practice of Responsible Conduct of Gambling (RCG) and Responsible Service of Alcohol (RSA) principles and requirements. All other hotel staff are required to have undergone RCG and RSA training and will be required to substantiate demonstrated practical experience.

On every shift, either the Hotel Manager (if present) or the Shift Manager will be designated as the RCG and RSA Manager for that shift. This person will have overall responsibility for ensuring enforcement of, and compliance with requirements.

The Licensee/Approved Manager will ensure that all relevant signage regarding the gaming machine area and RCG is affixed in appropriate parts of the hotel premises. Other materials in relation to RCG will be made available to all patrons of the hotel, including prominent display of access details for the NSW Government Gambling Help Line.

The Licensee/Approved Manager will also make available to all hotel patrons information on the Australian Hotels Association GameCare self-exclusion program, and on local problem gambling service providers. A list of these providers, sourced from the OLGR website, is included at Appendix 2. Although there are a limited number of these that might be considered as being in areas immediate to Williamtown, it is recognised that individuals requiring access to such a service may elect to do so in an area away from where they reside, or at a service near to their workplace etc. Given the hotel's proximity to the airport, it is also recognised that some element of the hotel clientele may be from other areas to which the listed services may be more convenient.

The Applicant will investigate opportunities to engage with the nearest problem gambling service providers (Mission Australia, Raymond Terrace and Gamblers Anonymous, Nelson Bay) to develop an effective risk management strategy in respect of the Hotel's gaming operations.

The Applicant will also join and actively participate in the Port/Stephens/Raymond Terrace Liquor Accord.

# 6. ADDITIONAL CONSULTATION CONDUCTED IN RELATION TO LIQUOR LICENCE APPLICATION & PROPOSED GAMING ACTIVITY

As detailed in Section 2.1, the hotel licence for the Williamtown Hotel was granted in August 2013. The application process for the hotel licence was undertaken commencing in December 2012. In the Notice of Intention to apply for a liquor licence or a licence authorisation (NOI), dated 6 December 2012, the following disclosure in respect of proposed liquor-related activity was included:

'The applicant will install a number of electronic gaming machines (EGMs) on the premises. The applicant will seek to source EGM entitlements from within the Port Stephens Local Government Area (LGA) in to so as to avoid any net increase in the number of EGMs that are available to the LGA community. The installation of EGMs is subject of a separate application process'.

The NOI was provided directly to twenty stakeholders, including statutory bodies, and occupants of private residential and commercial premises in proximity to the hotel site. No concerns were raised in relation to the gaming activities to be conducted at the hotel.

Further face-to-face consultation was conducted between a representative of Knightsbridge Estate Group (Licensee) and the occupants of neighbouring residences in Lavis Lane. No concerns were stated by these households in respect of any of the hotel's liquor-related activities, including EGM availability.

The Applicant confirms the content of the statement made in the NOI in respect of this application.
