To whom it may concern,

I would like to show my support for the review and change in current liquor licence legislation.

Specifically i would like to bring to your attention:

No take-away liquor sales after 10pm

This imposed legislation will mean that many businesses who have no direct correlation to alcohol related violence now have to cease trading.

I own a small business called 'Dial a Drink' where we provide a responsible service to patrons in their own home, and the imposition of this change in legislation means that we are losing trade, for legislation which should not implicate my business.

We used to do 60% of our trade within 10pm-12am with the majority of our patrons being over the age of 30. These drinkers are not out to 'get wild' or 'start fights' or 'pre-load' before going out. They simply will enjoy alcohol in moderation with friends whilst at home instead of going out.

We strictly follow the responsible service of alcohol when taking orders and also delivering orders. We will not take an order if the patron calling to place an order sounds intoxicated and drivers also assess the state of people when they were delivering alcohol to houses - the same way a bar tender would.

Any help would be greatly appreciated, as this change in legislation affects my business greatly.
