I am writing to express my strong objection to Sydney's lockout laws.

First, the lockout laws aren't working. Assaults are down in the lockout zone, but foot traffic is down by a larger percentage.

Second, the laws are bad for the economy. Numerous businesses have closed, and thousands of people have lost work. The centre of Sydney is becoming a laughing stock, when it is supposed to be a vibrant, global destination that is attractive to both locals and tourists.

Third, the laws are bad for Sydney's culture. The night-time economy underpins countless cultural and artistic activities, such as music, dancing, and socializing. These activities are under threat.

Fourth, and most important, the laws are immoral. I belong to the vast majority of Sydney residents who have been punished for crimes they didn't commit, and will never commit.

I would fully support alternative laws that targeted the minority of anti-social individuals in our community, for example, with harsher penalties for assaults. People respond to incentives. At the moment, the incentives are skewed in a way that disincentivizes Sydney's nightlife for the benign majority, rather than disincentivizing anti-social behaviour for the violent minority. This is twisted.
