To The Honourable Ian Callinan AC QC,

I was hoping to express my opinion as part of the independent review of the impact of liquor law reforms.

My husband and I have two young children, and our preference is to spend our evenings entertaining friends at home rather than going out. We often serve alcoholic beverages eg. wine and cocktails which are always consumed in a civilised manner. We usually only organise dinner and beverages at a late hour, after the children have gone to sleep.

We have been impacted by the 10pm cut-off on the sale of take-away alcohol, which includes the delivery of alcohol from local providers like Jimmy Brings. We believe that this rule provides an incentive for groups like us to move to a bar which does serve alcohol after 10pm, which is not in the interest of our broader society.

I support a change in legislation to remove the restriction on the home delivery of alcohol after 10pm, such that people are encouraged to stay at home and drink in a safe and quiet environment.
