much or you decided it was time to go home, the busses and trains had stopped and the fight for a cab was a long one.

Then, tragically, two young men lost their lives. The city mourned and rightly decided things had to change. The government's response, however, chose to deflect the blame and rushed through blanket laws without consultation. The lockout laws have been a failure.

What needs to change?

The lock-out laws have caused irreparable damage to the economic, social and cultural fabric of Sydney. Instead of the 1:30am lockout and 3.00am cease of service, the **7 key actions** below should be implemented together to curb the violence and keep Sydney open for all to enjoy.

- 1. Developing best-practice policing strategies;
- 2. Investing in 24/7 public transport;
- 3. Implementing integrated urban planning reform;
- 4. Encouraging diversification of after-dark activities;
- 5. Establishing anti-violence education & intervention campaigns:
- 6. Incentivising well-run venues; and
- 7. Appointing a **Night Mayor**.
