As an individual, I believe the lock out laws have negatively impacted the city of Sydney, both economically and culturally. It is also inhibited my personal rights. Finally, these laws have not worked.

Economically, it is very clear that these laws have negatively impacted Sydney. One only has to walk the streets of Kings Cross, Darlinghurst, the CBD and Oxford St to see this.
