I've enjoyed life in our residentially zoned  home with husband Ernest George since 1974. We are retired registered nurse and fine art lecturer.

We have participated in effecting tough social changes such as decentralisation of prostitution.

We therefore willingly support a deliberate decentralisation of 'night-life'.

Since introduction of licensed 24hour liquor trading, our life quality has progressively deteriorated with escalating offensive noise and antisocial behaviour happening outside our home in a predominately residential street
