As a 10 year resident of Kings Cross I would like to register my support for the 1.30am lock outs, 3am cessation of liquor sales, 10pm take-away liquor laws and the annual liquor licence fee program.

The diminishing of violent, drunken anti-social behaviour has been obvious to the casual observer, and is also reflected in fewer hospital admissions, arrests and so on.

There's been a lot of talk around the closure of a number of high profile venues, most of which could be fairly characterised as large drinking barns who made their money serving alcohol to drunk people.
