

Liquor Law Reforms - Alcohol Delivery

To The Honourable Ian Callinan AC QC,

I understand that you are currently conducting an independent review of the impact of liquor law reforms. I am writing to you in regards to the 10pm cut-off on the sale of take-away alcohol, specifically the delivery of alcohol. I am a PhD level psychologist and new mother. I do not have the time or capacity to go to bars and clubs and am rarely out past 10pm these days. I do, however, enjoy a glass of wine on occasion after my daughter has gone to sleep. My husband works in theatre and is often out at nights, and I am therefore unable to leave my home. We also entertain at home a lot now (as it's tricky to go out with a young baby) and have, from time to time, run out of alcohol for our guests.

On the above occasions, we use a service called Jimmy Brings. This service delivers alcohol to homes in the inner city and surrounding suburbs and was significantly impacted by the 10pm cut-off. This service caters to individuals who want to drink responsibly in the comfort and safety of their own home. It should not be subjected to the same rules that apply to bars and clubs as it is an entirely different service, catering to a different clientele. It actually supports the purpose of the new legislation - to encourage safe and responsible drinking.

As such, I urge you to reconsider the 10pm cut off for the delivery of alcohol.
